Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Airports of Entry

All aircraft d must make their first landing and last take off from an Airport of Entry.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

The regulations require that persons subject to U.S. jurisdiction be licensed in order to engage in any travel-related transactions pursuant to travel to, from, and within Cuba. *Transactions related to tourist travel are not licensable*. This restriction includes tourist travel to Cuba from or through a third country such as Mexico or Canada. U.S. law enforcement authorities enforce these regulations at U.S. airports and pre-clearance facilities in third countries. Travelers who fail to comply with Department of the Treasury regulations could face civil penalties and criminal prosecution upon return to the United States.

Any foreign aircraft that enters Cuban airspace without authorization or which deviates from an approved air corridor may be intercepted, forced to land and subject to damages and penalties without recourse.

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → General license or Specific license as specified by <u>U.S. Dept of the Treasury</u> (OFAC)
- → File an <u>eAPIS</u> manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Depart from an approved airport: http://www.cbp.gov/xp/cgov/travel/travel_news/poe_cuba.xml

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → Visa
- Non-U.S issued Medical Insurance (temporary policies issued by Cuba are available)

Pilots - Same as for Passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

Aircraft -

- → 2 General Declarations for Customs, 2 for Immigration and 1 for Public Health
- → 2 Passenger manifests for Customs, 1for Immigration and 1 for Public Health
- → 7 Cargo manifests for Customs (1), Cargo (3), AP (1), Public Health (1) and Veterinary (1)
- → Certificate of Aircraft liability insurance

Exit Requirements (Departing Cuba)

- → File eAPIS manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other country requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meets those requirements.

The items listed below are for the pilot's reference to determine if the aircraft meets the minimum instrument and equipment requirements, of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

International general aviation aircraft must be adjusted to the provisions of the ICAO Annex 6. Part II. International General Aviation – Airplanes, Chapter 6 and Chapter 7.

Additionally, the equipment listed in the Cuba AIP meets the same requirements of F.A.R. Part 91, Subpart C, 91.205 for VFR and IFR flight.

Survival equipment for operations over water:

→ Flight over water for more then 90 Km (50 NM) of the nearest coastal line.

Lifeboat or flotation means approved for each aircraft occupant.

- → Flight over water for more than 30 minutes of flight or 180 Km (100 NM) from the nearest coastal line.
 - 1. An approved life vest / life jacket equipped with localization light for each occupant.
 - 2. Approved life raft, equipped with localization light, with enough floatable disposal and capacity to accommodate all the aircraft occupants.
 - 3. At least one signal pyrotechnic device for each raft

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop / Overflight

A planned technical stop is not advised. Guantanamo is closed to civilian aircraft, except in an emergency.

Technical stops and overflights require prior approval/license from the Department of Permissions and Flight Planning and fees are accessed.

It is possible for individuals or operators to obtain the required licenses to overfly Cuba; however, it is a lengthy and involved process. For this reason, many pilots choose to obtain their overflight permits by using the services of licensed handlers, who can offer guidelines and greatly facilitate the process. At least 48 hours should be allowed to process the paperwork. Exceptions may be made for a short notice request or emergency reasons.

A filed IFR flight plan and permit is required each time an aircraft overflies Cuba. The overflight permit number should be included in the flight plan additional comments section (Line 18 on an ICAO flight plan form). A flight plan must be received not less than one hour prior to aircraft entering the Cuban Flight Information Region (FIR). Strict adherence to navigation routes and air corridors is necessary.

Non-Scheduled (Charter)

Non-scheduled commercial aircraft overflying *or landing* in Cuba must obtain prior approval at least 10 days in advance, contact:

Private Flights

Private Flights overflying or landing in Cuba require 48 hours before the proposed date of arrival.

The flight plan for private aircraft must be received by the aeronautics authorities not less than one hour before entering Cuba FIR. For approval contact:

Fees

Fuel

Fuel is available at all AOEs but in most cases, only jet fuel. Currently, MUCM, MUHA and MUVR are the only entry airports that offer Avgas as well as Jet A1. Contact the airport authority in advance of departure from the U.S.

Night VFR

Night VFR is not permitted in Cuba without special permission from the Cuban air traffic authorities. Contact the Cuban Civil Aviation Authority for contact information of the ATS unit at your airport of interest.

Island Hopping

Each Island in the Caribbean may be its own sovereign nation. Please refer to specific country information prior to flying to other islands within the Caribbean.

Public Health Requirements

Aircraft -

Aircraft arriving from foreign countries and landing at any of the international airports in the Republic of Cuba must have been fumigated in flight prior to such landing. Additional fumigation may be done by the Cuban authorities, if deemed necessary.
