



Airports that have had a triggering strike and have not had a Wildlife Hazard Assessment (WHA), are required to conduct a WHA in accordance with 139.337 (b).

Review of Wildlife Hazard Management Plans

14 CFR 139.337 (f) (6) states that the Wildlife Hazard Management Plan must include *Procedures to review and evaluate the wildlife hazard management plan every 12 consecutive months or following an event described in paragraphs (b)(1), (b)(2), and (b)(3) of this section, including: (i) The plan's effectiveness in dealing with known wildlife hazards on and in the airport's vicinity and (ii) Aspects of the wildlife hazards described in the wildlife hazard assessment that should be reevaluated.*

Airports must develop and follow procedures for this review after a triggering event, and include in Section 139.337 (f) (6) of the Wildlife Hazard Management Plan (WHMP) these procedures. A sample worksheet is attached and can be used as a template for this purpose. Compliance will be verified during annual Part 139 Inspections.
