

SEC4.10 – FAA Programmatic Risk Management

Audience Program Managers and other employees dealing with NAS systems throughout their lifecycle, especially those assigned to or supporting acquisition programs.

Overview The FAA Programmatic Risk Management course is part of the overall ATO Integrated Curriculum on Project/Program Management and System Engineering. It addresses the needs of individuals involved in project or program management across the agency, particularly performing system engineers, project engineers, program managers and IPT/PT members. Participants will be introduced to the FAA model for programmatic risk management and will be provided opportunities to apply the model to real situations.

Learning Objectives At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Apply the FAA Programmatic Risk Process Model
- Identify the work products produced through the Risk Management Process
- Implement the Risk Management Process and its products
- Recognize what to do with the work products and how to use them in decision-making and managing projects/programs
- Integrate other risk related products and results into a common portrayal of risk on a program
- Identify available tools.
