Mission Statement



The Authority strives to ensure the safety and security of the traveling public; is dedicated to maintaining a superior and reliable level of airport services for our island residents and tourists; and is committed to supporting the development of air linkages and facilities which are integral to the island's future economic growth.



Airport Capacity



➤ Terminal:

- 767,553 square feet with 76 ticket counter positions
- 48 immigration stations and 42 customs inspection stations
- Processing capacity of 5,000 international passengers/hour

➤ Gates:

- 21 aircraft parking positions
- 18 common use terminal gates (17 jetways/1 Busgate)

➤ Primary Runway – 10,000 feet

- Design underway for 2,000 feet runway extension
- Anticipate completion in FY 2008
- Strengthening and extension to accommodate trans-Pacific flights

➤ Secondary Runway – 10,000 feet

- 2,000 feet extension completed in 2005

➤ Parallel Taxiway

- Phase I substantially completed March 2006
- Anticipate completion in FY 2008

Aprons:


- 174,218 square feet of apron fronting cargo facility

Cargo Activity (Metric Tons) – FY 2001-2006




Deplaned Cargo & Mail


