
Dear Mr. Harrington:

This letter responds to your request for legal interpretation dated October 15, 2012. Specifically, you have asked for clarification regarding the minimum course hour requirements for a Flight Instructor Refresher Course (FIRC).

Section 61.197 permits a flight instructor to renew his or her instructor certificate by submitting an application and satisfactorily completing “an approved flight instructor refresher course consisting of ground training or flight training, or a combination of both.” Appendix K of part 141 states that a FIRC “must include a combined total of 16 hours of aeronautical knowledge training, flight training, or any combination of ground and flight training[.]” Current FAA guidance indicates that a FIRC curriculum submitted to the FAA for approval “must consist of no fewer than 16 hours of ground and/or flight instruction.” Advisory Circular 61-83G. Although there is no stated regulatory minimum in §61.197, the FAA has consistently indicated that the standard for receiving FAA approval of a FIRC curriculum is 16 hours. The FAA believes that it is necessary to maintain a level of standardization in FIRC curricula and has emphasized the coverage of program areas essential to enhance the knowledge, skills, and instructional capability of flight instructors. Advisory Circular 61-83G.
