ORDER

Camber Corporation ("Camber") has protested the alleged failure by the FAA Global Positioning System ("GPS") Team, AND-70 ("Product Team") to make progress in connection with its implementation of the re-competition mandated by two prior orders, FAA Order ODRA-98-79 issued in the consolidated cases docketed as 98-ODRA-00079 and 98-ODRA-00080, and FAA Order ODRA 98-95 issued for 98-ODRA-00102 (the "Re-competition"), concerning the GPS technical assistance contract (the "GPS TAC contract").

For the reasons set forth therein, I adopt the attached Findings and Recommendations of the Office of Dispute Resolution for Acquisition ("ODRA") and therefore dismiss this protest as moot and direct the Product Team: (1) on or before March 7, 1999, to issue instructions for the submission of new Best And Final Offers; (2) on or before May 5, 1999, to conduct oral presentations; (3) on or before June 29, 1999, to complete the evaluation of offers under the Re-competition; (4) on or before June 30, 1999, to award a new GPS TAC contract, unless the present contractor, Advanced Management Technology, Inc. ("AMTI") has again been selected as the successful offeror; and (5) if AMTI has not been selected as the awarded, to provide for an expeditious transition to the new contractor and to terminate the AMTI contract for the convenience of the FAA. I also direct the Product Team to report to the ODRA on a monthly basis regarding the

progress being made towards achieving these milestone dates and to file an appropriate motion with the ODRA should any modification to the solicitation and evaluation schedule become necessary.

This is the final Agency order in this matter. To the extent that this decision is subject to review, such review shall be sought in accordance with 49 U.S.C. §46110. A petition for review must be filed with the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, or in the court of appeals of the United States for the circuit in which the petitioner resides or has its principal place of business. The petition must be filed not later than 60 days after the date that this order is issued. A copy of any such petition must also be filed with the FAA Office of Dispute Resolution for Acquisition on the date it is filed with the appropriate circuit court of appeals.
