C. Scott Maravilla

Dispute Resolution Officer and Administrative Judge

Administrative Judge Maravilla came to the Office of Dispute Resolution for Acquisition (ODRA) in 2008 after serving in the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Office of the Chief Counsel for over three years. On March 16, 2010, he was elected to membership in the American Law Institute.

Mr. Maravilla received his law degree *cum laude* from the Georgetown University Law Center in May, 2000. During the spring semester of his second year in law school, he held a full-time clerkship in The White House, Office of Counsel to the President. Mr. Maravilla holds a Masters degree from King's College, The University of London, and a Bachelors degree from The University of Texas at Austin.

Mr. Maravilla began his career as a judicial clerk to Judge Roger B. Andewelt at the United States Court of Federal Claims from 2000 to 2001, where he assisted with the adjudication of claims against the U.S. government. He spent two years from 2001 to 2003 as an Associate with a large Wall Street law firm in New York. While in private practice, Mr. Maravilla was very active with the firm's pro bono practice. He helped establish the firm's 9/11 Pro Bono group, which included apprising the firm of all tax legislation enacted at both the federal and state level with regard to the victims of 9/11 and represented the family of a firefighter. Mr. Maravilla also clerked for Justice Dale Wainwright of the Texas Supreme Court from 2003 to 2004. He joined the FAA in 2005 as an attorney in the Acquisition and Commercial Law Division.

Mr. Maravilla is a prolific legal scholar and his works have appeared in, among others, *Tulane Journal of International and Comparative Law*, *Tulane Journal of Technology and Intellectual Property Law*, and *Florida Journal of International Law*. Mr. Maravilla is active in the bar serving as Vice-Chair of the American Bar Association (ABA) Bid Protest Committee, Vice-Chair of the ABA Aerospace and Defense Industries Committee, Assistant Treasurer for the Board of Contract Appeals Bar Association, and previously served on the Association of the Bar of the City of New York's Committee on National Security Affairs. He also served on the Contracts Team for the Afghanistan Transitional Commercial Law Project, an ABA – United Nations sponsored task force organized to assist in the development of a modern commercial code for that country.

Mr. Maravilla served from 2006-2010 as a member, including a stint as Chairman, of the City of Rockville Board of Appeals, a quasi-judicial panel. He was also appointed, while in Texas, by Governor Rick Perry to the Texas Advisory Council on Emergency Medical Services.
