

PARC Telecon Summary

March 25, 2010

1. RNP SAAAR Transition to ILS

Cramer

More illustrations were finished in the details of the RNP to ILS package, and a recommendation letter to send to Peggy Gilligan has been drafted. Dave Nakamura is reviewing the letter and it will be posted for PARC review shortly.

2. RNP Charting WG

Rivas

Comments received on Recommendations on RNP SAAAR Instrument Approach Procedure (IAP) Chart Clutter? The Working Group held 6 telecons, and developed and reviewed their recommendations. They also identified issues in the Annex that were beyond the scope of the group but were identified as gaps in criteria. These were the direct to the IF clearance, which will be taken to the Charting Forum, and that there is a gray area between simplicity and leveraging complete benefits. When should multiple IFs exist and when they should be restricted to a single intermediate fix? Pedro will be correcting some minor typographical errors and send a recommendations letter for Peggy to Dave Nakamura for review.

3. PARC Priorities Work Development AT

4. Autopilot Use/Rulemaking AT

The team has finished the first draft of the Rulemaking Proposal Request and sent it to Mark Steinbicker for review. Jerry is now working on a proposal letter to the FAA to formalize the actual wording they would like to see in the rule change.

5. FltDAWG

The Working Group held F2F meetings the previous week. They are planning two more meetings, in May and July, to hopefully wrap up discussions and get draft documents to the PARC for review this summer. A discussion of insights gained and other issues will be put on the Agenda for the June F2F.

6. AC20-138B

New Business

The June F2F location will be held in the Washington DC area. The Overland Room at AMTI headquarters in Arlington, VA will be checked for availability.

The Communications Working Group provided the following update:

For the FANS over Iridium project -

- a) CMI continues operations in Guam area. We are collecting data and investigating solutions to some problems. The aircraft is suspect.
- b) Cargolux intends to begin their operations on their global route system beginning 25 March 2010.
- c) The North Atlantic ANSPs (UK, Iceland, Canada) agreed this week to cooperate in the U.S. (FAA) sponsored initiative to collect data to assess viability of Iridium for FANS operations. Portugal is pending.

The satellite voice project is continuing to progress. The PARC CWG intends to cooperate with the new task force between North Atlantic and Asia-Pacific Regions sponsored by ICAO Montreal. Administered through the Paris Office. Other related topics include use of portable phones, and MEL relief of HF radio.

Our next meeting is 6-7 April in Scottsdale, AZ hosted by Iridium. In addition to the above projects, we will also be discussing -

- a) the Global Operational Data Link Document (GOLD), performance-based communications, formalizing RCP and surveillance performance criteria for airspace, aircraft approval and operational authorizations, taking into consideration the FAA projects to revise ACs for data link installations.
- b) Implications of the new infrastructure with Inmarsat I4 satellites, Classic Aero and Swift Broadband and validation.

The PARC Charter renewal process is still moving forward. A minor re-scoping of PARC tasks will be done to make sure our focus is not too broad. A review of PARC Membership is still being done. It has been agreed that there is a need to de-couple PARC F2F meetings from other events, so the October F2F date might be changed.

Oct. 14-15, 2010. Oct 2010 NBAA Annual Conference is Oct. 19-21 in Atlanta. It has been suggested that the PARC hold its Oct.
