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ICAO NOTAM Format Transition



The FAA is changing

the format for Notices to Airmen (NOTAM) to align with international standards. Target Date for implementation is Winter 2024.



Our mission

is to implement high quality, discoverable and accessible ICAO-compliant NOTAMs.



FAA policies and procedures

will be revised to incorporate ICAO Standards and Recommended Procedures (SARPS). The Federal NOTAM System (FNS) will be updated to publish all NOTAMs in ICAO Format.

ICAO Phase 1

ICAO Format Familiarization Enhancement

The Federal NOTAM System will receive a software update that improves how it automatically translates digitally originated U.S. NOTAMs into ICAO format. These ICAO-formatted NOTAMs will be available in the NOTAM Search website and the NOTAM Distribution Service (NDS).



Full Transition to ICAO Format

The FAA will adopt ICAO requirements for all NOTAMs and implement these requirements via policy and enhancements to the Federal NOTAM System. This implementation will include NOTAM formatting, numbering, series, and NOTAM codes.



Current FAA format remains official format for all domestic NOTAMs



ICAO format becomes official format for domestically issued NOTAMs

Numbering

Does not include ICAO series or NOTAM numbering



Includes ICAO series and NOTAM numbering

Data Feed

ICAO formatted NOTAMs provided via NOTAM Search and NDS.



All NOTAMs originated in U.S. are provided by FAA in ICAO format

The effective time for the NOTAM is June 23, 2021 from 1700 to 2300z.
