Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents">ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land first at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs & immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Passports U S Citizens require valid passports (for re-entry to the U.S.)
- → Visa for some countries (not required for USA, Canada & Mexico)
- → Immigration Card One (1) Card per person (Will be provided upon arrival).

Pilots -

- → Passport
- → Immigration Card One (1) Card per person (Will be provided upon arrival).
- → Bahamas Inward Declaration and Cruising Permit (C7A) (3) copies (for multiple island destinations)

Aircraft -

An aircraft not registered in The Bahamas shall not fly in or over Bahamian territory unless it carries all documents that it is required to carry under the law of the country in which it is registered.

Exit Requirements (Departing The Bahamas)

- → File eAPIS manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan (DVFR or IFR) (1-800-WX-BRIEF) (Form CADD 63A1)
- → Call Ú.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry
- → Depart from a Bahamian designated airport of entry (AOE)
- → One copy of The Bahamas Customs/Aircraft General Declaration (Outward/Inward) form C7
- → One copy of The Bahamas Immigration Form per person
- → Airborne, call Miami Radio 126.7 for a discrete transponder code before ADIZ

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other country requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meets those requirements.

All aircraft operating in The Bahamas must adhere to the Provisions of ICAO Annex 6 Part 1, Chapters 6 and 7. (Operation of Aircraft), part 1 (International Commercial Air Transport), chapter 6 (Airplane Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents), and Chapter 7 (Airplane Communications and Navigation Equipment).

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets *minimum* instrument and equipment requirements, of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

- → Two independent radio communications systems (IFR)
- → ELT (406 MHz is currently waived by The Bahamas)
- → Mode C transponder
- > Individual floatation device
- → Life raft(s) (with survivor locator light/flares) may be required depending upon type of aircraft and distance from land

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Overflight/Technical Stop

Prior permission, other than an accepted flight plan, is *not* required for non-scheduled airline operations for overflight, or technical stops.

Overflight requires all of the documents required by the country of registration.

Non-Scheduled Commercial Flights

The following requirements must be met by international non-scheduled commercial flights operated by foreign airlines in The Bahamas.

Prior permission and an accepted flight plan are required for non-scheduled airline operations embarking/disembarking passengers and/or lading/unlading cargo within the territory of The Bahamas. Permission must be obtained from the Director of Civil Aviation not less than 48 hours prior to intended operation.

Application for prior permission must include the following information:

- → Operator/business name, address, and telephone number
- → Aircraft type and registration marks
- → Dates, times, and locations of intended operations
- → Location(s) of passenger embarkation/ disembarkation and/or cargo lading/unlading as applicable
- → Purpose of flight, number of passengers, and/or description of cargo as applicable
- → Copy of Airworthiness certificate
- → Copy of Air carrier certificate
- → Copy of Insurance certificate

Separate documents shall be submitted at each aerodrome if operations are conducted at more than one aerodrome.

The following documents must be submitted in triplicate by aircraft operators for clearance into and out of The Bahamas (No visas are required in connection with these documents):

- → The Bahamas Customs/Aircraft General Declaration (Outward/Inward) form C7
- → Aircraft Cargo Manifest form C8

The following documents may be required in triplicate by aircraft operators for clearance into and out of The Bahamas:

- → Declaration of Consumable Stores On Board Aircraft form C5a
- → Declaration of Consumable Stores on Board Vessel form C5
- → Aircraft Passenger Manifest form C9

The Customs Department indicates clearance approval by returning an endorsed copy of the Aircraft General Declaration to the aircraft operator

Private Flights

An accepted flight plan is required for private international operations.

Prior permission is required for private international operations conducted to or from a Bahamian aerodrome during other than published hours of operation. Permission must be obtained from the Director of Civil Aviation not less than 48 hours prior to intended operation.

Lynden Pindling Intl is open H24, Grand Bahama Intl 1100 - 0300 UTC and Family Island Airports from sunrise to sunset.

Float Planes

All seaplanes shall, in addition to floatation landing equipment, have attached wheels appropriate for operations to/from conventional land-based airports.

Fees

There are varying fees for landing, parking, hangarage, long term storage, passenger services (departure tax), terminal use and security. The fees also vary between the privately owned, (Lynden Pindling International / Nassua), the government owned (Grand Bahama International, Freeport) and the remaining islands, referred to as Family Islands (consisting of private and government owned).

Note: Other fees may apply at private airports

Air Navigation Service Charges are not currently levied by The Bahamas.

Flights that don't take off or land in U.S. territory but fly in U.S. controlled airspace will be charged overflight fees by U.S. authorities while transitioning U.S. airspace, including above Bahamian domestic airspace.

Fuel

Fuel is not available at all airports of entry. You should confirm fuel availability in advance of the flight.

Night VFR

Flying VFR between sunset and sunrise is not permitted in The Bahamas unless that aerodrome has been designated by the Director of Civil Aviation as being available for night operations. Requests for permission to operate at night should be made to the Deputy Director of Air Traffic Services or Chief Operations Officer in charge of operations during the hours 9AM to 5PM Mon - Fri and from Watch Supervisor on duty holiday, weekends and after 5PM weekdays.

The Director of Civil Aviation may grant prior written approval for specific VFR night flying operations.

Night VFR flights will be in accordance with Instrument Flight Rules. Requests should be made at least 8 hours in advanced prior to intended flight.

Intra Island Flying

The Customs Department may permit *private* aircraft operators to submit an Inward Declaration and Cruising Permit for flying from island to island. A flight plan is not required

Island Hopping

Each Island in the Caribbean may be its own sovereign nation. Please refer to specific country information prior to flying to other islands within the Caribbean.

Public Health Requirements

Aircraft – No public health measures are required to be carried out in respect of aircraft entering The Bahamas.

Passengers – Disembarking passengers are not required to present vaccination certificates. Temporary health formalities may be applied to meet unforeseen situations and will be notified by NOTAM.
