Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents">Entry/Exit Documents. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

The international flight of aircraft in the airspace of the Republic of Belarus shall be carried out only on the basis of issued permission in accordance with conditions indicated in:

- → The international treaties of the Republic of Belarus on air service
- → Permission for carrying out single flight issued by Aviation Department of the Ministry of Transport and Communications of the Republic of Belarus (via FCCC)
- → Permission for carrying out single flights legalized through Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Belarus

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → Visa
- → Customs Declaration

Pilots - Same as passengers

Aircraft -

- Aircraft Registration Certificate.
- + Airworthiness Certificate.
- → Aircraft Noise Certificate.
- → Aircraft Radio License.
- → Aircraft flight logbook.
- → Air Operator Certificate and Aircraft Operating Certificate (in copy).
- → The appropriate crew member certificates for every crew member.
- → Crew member and aircraft insurance certificates, third party liability insurance certificate (in copies).
- → Flight Operating Manual.
- → Flight Operation Manual (to the extent necessary for a given flight).
- → Aeronautical information documents.
- → General Declaration.
- > Consolidated cargo sheet.
- → Passenger Manifest.
- > Cargo Manifest.

Exit Requirements (Departing Belarus)

- → Depart from an AOE
- → File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- > File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Any flight on which an aircraft crosses the Republic of Belarus state border and that of another State is deemed to be an international flight.

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

In General – Commercial air transport aircraft operating within the Republic of Belarus must adhere to the provision of ANNEX 6 of ICAO– Operation of Aircraft, Part 1 – International Commercial Air Transport – Aeroplane, Chapter 6 (Aeroplane Instruments, Equipment and Flight documents) and Chapter 7 (Aeroplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

Specific -

- → SSR Transponder
- → ACAS II for aircraft with maximum certificated take-off mass exceeding 5700 kilograms or authorized to carry more than 19 passengers and non-commercial aircraft with maximum certificated take-off mass exceeding 15000 kilograms or authorized to carry more than 30 passengers
- → Carriage and operation of 8.33 kHz channel spacing radio equipment is mandatory throughout the ICAO EUR Region for flights above FL 195
- → GPWS
- → ELT capable of transmitting emergency signals on 121.5 MHz and 406
- → On all flight with single-engine and that multi-engine aircraft not capable to maintain the prescribed minimum safe altitude in the event of engine failure, the following emergency equipment shall be carried:
 - Two signal flares of the day and night type
 - A signal sheet (1x1 m) in a reflecting color
 - A knife
 - An electric hand torch
 - Survival equipment in accordance with ANNEX 6, Part 1

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop

Same requirements as non-scheduled flights.

Overflight

Where the bilateral agreement between the user and FCCC exists, the request for carrying out a transit single/private flight of a foreign aircraft along the ATS routes of the Republic of Belarus shall be submitted to UMMMZDZX, UMMDYAYX not later than 1 hour before the planned time of departure.

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

Non-scheduled (Considered to be in Belarus as single or private) flights shall be operated on the basis of permission issued on preliminary request.

The request for carrying out a single/private flight of a foreign aircraft along the ATS routs as well as to the airports (aerodromes) of the Republic of Belarus shall be submitted to FCCC not later than 5 (five) working days (except Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays) before the beginning of planned flight from 0700 to 1700 UTC.

The permission for non-scheduled (single, private) flights is valid during 24 hours starting from ETD, indicated in the permission.

Private Flights

Same as for Non-scheduled operations

Fees

Users should anticipate varying fees for take-off and landing charges, security, parking, off hour service, and air navigation charges. Refer to free on-line AIP.

Fuel

Jet A1 is available at all AOE's. AvGas is only available at UMII.

Night VFR

(ENR 1.2-1 para 10 & 13)

Visual flights at night shall envisage:

- → Piloting of aircraft along the line of natural horizon, light and ground features with simultaneous control via the instruments over its spatial position
- → Flight operation maintaining the intervals of horizontal separation established for IFR and the intervals of vertical separation
- → Maintaining the assigned level (altitude) taking into account the artificial obstacles
- → The ATS unit provides separations between the aircraft using the surveillance facilities and (or) using the flight crew position reports
- → The presence of continuous two-way radio communication between the ATS unit and the flight crew

Public Health Requirements

Aircraft - In case of suspected infectious disease or any evidence of possible health risks on board of aircraft, the pilot-in-command shall report promptly to Air Traffic Control to ensure, that information is provided to the State Public Health Authority.

Pilots should refer to the DOT website below for any current requirements.

DOT: Aircraft Disinsection Requirements

Passengers - Public health authorities of the Republic of Belarus do not require that the crew members of foreign aircraft and foreign passengers arriving into the territory of the Republic of Belarus should have a vaccination certificate.

Pets

Import to the Republic of Belarus from foreign states of animals is admitted by the permission of the Belorussian Department of the State Veterinary Inspection on the State Border and Transport of the Ministry of Agriculture and Provisions of the Republic of Belarus.

It is allowed to import up to two dogs and/or cats per person for personal use without import permission but with international passport or veterinary certificate. The veterinary certificate shall be issued in the country-exporter language and in Russian and shall indicate methods and dates of veterinary treatments as well as of animal vaccinations, laboratory research and obtained results
