# Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

### Airports of Entry

For information about which aerodromes provide customs service, see the *Canada Flight Supplement* or the *Water Aerodrome Supplement*, Section B, "Aerodrome/Facility Directory." If the heading CUST (customs) appears in an aerodrome table, the aerodrome is an airport of entry (AOE) with customs service for international flights.

### **Entry/Exit Requirements**

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest

- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at <a href="IFIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents">ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents</a>. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Pilots must make their own customs arrangements by calling 1-888-226-7277 at least two hours but not more than 48 hours before flying into Canada. Pilots are also cautioned that for flight arrivals outside of the established hours, customs services may not always be available. Where available, call-out charges may be levied.

Private aircraft landing in Canada for non-commercial purposes need not obtain prior permission. However, the pilot must file a flight plan. ### **Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)**

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land first at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs & immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

Passports - U.S. citizens require valid passports, including visiting crew members. NEXUS Cards and Enhanced Drivers Licenses will not be accepted for travel via air <a href="http://travel.state.gov/travel/cis\_pa\_tw/cis/cis\_1082.html">http://travel.state.gov/travel/cis\_pa\_tw/cis/cis\_1082.html</a>.

Visa – No Visa is require for U.S. citizens

General Declaration - Private, business, tourist or military aircraft requiring customs clearance when entering Canada are not required to submit a general declaration except in the Northwest Territories (north of N60 degrees). However, they are required to report verbally to customs. Furthermore, the aircraft may be recorded on a specified form supplied by the Canada Border Services Agency to ensure adequate control of the aircraft while it is in Canada.

### **Exit Requirements (Departing Canada)**

A general declaration or equivalent document is not required for any aircraft departing Canada.

### **Flight Documents**

U.S. recreational pilot certificates and sport pilot certificates are not recognized in Canada.

Licenses and certificates that meet the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) standards are valid for operating aircraft between the U.S. and Canada.

The CARs require pilots to carry proof of liability insurance on board their aircraft when operating in Canadian airspace. This applies to all aircraft, including private, amateur-built and ultralight aircraft. The type of coverage is based on the aircraft's gross take-off weight (CAR 606.02).

### Additional Flight Information

### Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

In addition to U.S. aircraft airworthiness and 14 CFR Part 119 certification requirements, most countries adhere to ICAO Annex 6 which defines aircraft instruments, equipment and documents. Exceptions or additions to those rules are listed below for reference only.

For information on the rules governing the requirements for aircraft equipment, both generally and for specific types of aircraft and flights, refer to the sections on Transport Canada's CARs website that are listed in Table 1.5, "Aircraft Equipment Requirements."

ELTs are required for most general aviation aircraft (see CARs, section 605.38, "ELT," and Table 1.5.4, "Minimum ELT Equipment Required for Aircraft"). There is no requirement for 406 MHz ELT in Canada at this time.

### **RVSM**

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

### **Technical Stop / Overflight (Charters)**

ICAO registered state commercial air operators can transit Canadian airspace or conduct technical stops at Canadian airports for scheduled and non-scheduled commercial flights without further authorization from Transport Canada provided the air operator holds a current Canadian FAOC valid for the type of aircraft being operated.

### **Technical Stop / Overflight (Private)**

Private aircraft flying over or landing in Canada for non-commercial purposes need not obtain prior permission. However, the pilot must file a flight plan.

### Non-Scheduled Flights (Charters)

For non-scheduled air transport service aircraft flights into and out of Canada, the foreign air operator must: (1) hold a Canadian FAOC issued by the Minister of Transport in accordance with CARs, section 701.01, "Application"; (2) obtain prior permission from the Canadian Transportation Agency unless the commercial air transport service is otherwise provided for in a bilateral air services agreement between Canada and the State of certification of the foreign air operator; and (3) possess a non-scheduled international service license issued by the Canadian Transportation Agency.
