Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Airports of Entry

HDAM Ambouli International Airport

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

→ General Declaration

- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at <u>IFIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents</u>. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend filing inbound at this time)
- > File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → Visa for U.S. Citizens
- → Vaccination Certificate (if coming from a yellow fever, malaria or small pox infected area)
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card

Pilots – Same as passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

Aircraft -

- → General Declaration 1 for Health Service
- → Passenger Manifest 1 for Police Service
- → Cargo Manifest 1 for Taxation service

Note: If no passengers are embarking or disembarking and no articles are loaded or unloaded, no aircraft documents, except copies of the general declaration, need to be submitted to the above authorities.

Exit Requirements (Departing Djibouti)

- → Same documentation as listed in Entry Requirements "Aircraft" above.
- → Depart from an AOE
- → File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Republic of Djibouti must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annexe 6. Operation of aircraft Part 1 – International Commercial Air Transport – Aeroplanes, Chapter 6 (Aeroplane instruments, equipment and flight documents) and Chapter 7 (Aeroplane communication and navigation equipment).

All flights must be capable of maintain two way communication at all times and have the equipment in accordance with it's flight plan.

On flights with single engine and multi-engined aircraft which are not capable of maintaining the prescribed minimum safe altitude in the event of engine failure, the following emergency equipment shall be carried:

- → An emergency location transmitter (ELT)
- → Two signal flares of the day and night type
- → Signal sheet (1 x 1 m) in a reflecting colour
- → Signal mirror
- → An electric hand torch
- → A knife
- → 4 boxes of matches in waterproof containers
- → A compass
- → A ball of string

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop/Overflight

If an operator intends to carry out a non - scheduled flight for purpose of transiting or making technical stops at Republic of Djibouti territory, he shall apply to the Civil Aviation Office authority, for permission, no less than **72 hours** in advance of the intended flight. [sic].

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

If an operator intends to perform non-scheduled flights in Djibouti International Airport for purpose of embarking or disembarking passengers, cargo or mail, he shall apply to the Ministry of Transport for permission at least six (6) weeks in advance of the intended date of operation. Exceptionally, ten days before the date of the flight, for the following countries: Somalia, Yemen, Ethiopia, and Saudi-Arabia. [sic]

Private Flights

An application of permission must be addressed to the OAC (Office of Civil Aviation) at least **72 hours** before the estimated time of arrival.

Float Planes

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

Light Sport Aircraft

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

Fees

Users may anticipate fees for landing, parking, hangaring, long-term storage, passenger service fees (departure tax), lighting and Air Navigation fees.
