Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Aircraft operations at other airports may be permitted with ICAA approval. If approval is granted, operators shall comply with the preferred routings and procedures contained in ENR 3. Changes to an airport's status will be disseminated by NOTAM, as will the notification of any additional airports cleared by ICAA for slot time operations.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at <u>IFIM Home>General Information>International</u> <u>Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents</u>. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → Prior Permission Required from ICAA
- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Valid passport (valid for at least 6 months)
- → <u>Visa</u> (Visit the <u>Embassy of Iraq</u> for the most current visa information)
- Residency Stamp for stays greater than 10 days
- → Disembarking passengers are not required to present vaccination certificates unless arriving from an area infected with cholera, yellow fever or smallpox.

The Government of Iraq requirements for entry and residency for U.S. government contractors differ. Persons traveling to Iraq to work on U.S. government contracts should check with their contracting company and contracting officer's representative.

Pilots - Same as passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

Aircraft -

- → 4 General Declarations (1 Airport Authority, 1 Customs, 1 Immigration, 1 Health).
- → 4 Passenger Manifest (1 Airport Authority, 1 Customs, 1 Immigration, 1 Health).
- → 4 Cargo Manifest (1 Airport Authority, 1 Customs, 1 Immigration, 1 Health).

Exit Requirements (Departing Iraq)

- → Sane documents as required for Entry (see *Aircraft* above)
- → Prior Approval required to Depart
- → Exit Stamp
- → Depart from an AOE
- → File eAPIS manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

The ICAA operates 24 hours a day. The ICAA will resolve all questions that may arise as to whether or not an operator is approved to operate in the Baghdad FIR. The contact numbers for ICAA representatives are:

PPRs must be obtained before submitting a landing request to ICAA.

Civil aircraft will need to coordinate any and all ground servicing.

Aircraft operators must be familiar with, and follow, international intercept procedures contained in ICAO Annex 2, Rules of the Air, to the Chicago Convention, paragraph 3.8 and Appendix 2, Sections 2 and 3.

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

The following aircraft are not allowed to operate within Baghdad FIR:

B732, B721, B722, AN26, AN24, AN12, R721, R722, T154

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Iraq must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 – Operation of Aircraft, Part 1 – International Commercial Air Transport – Aeroplanes, Chapter 6 (Aeroplanes Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Aeroplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

- → RNAV-5 (pilots must confirm the viability of ground based navaids, if required, prior to flight
- → Mode 3/A transponder

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop / Overflight

In addition to receiving Prior Permission from the ICAA, Overflight or Technical Stop requires that either a Daily Overflight Request Form or a Landing Slot Request Form be completed (http://www.iraqcaa.com/). Request Forms must be submitted no later the 1500Z on the day prior to the flight. Technical Stop Slots may not be requested more than 24 hours before the day of operation and Overflight Requests may not be made more than 30 days before the day of operation.

Slot requests and changes must be submitted to ICAA no later than 1500Z the day prior to flight and no earlier than 24 hrs. prior to the day of operation.

Non-scheduled Flights may overfly or make non-traffic stops by applying for Prior Permission at least 48 hours before the commencement of flight.

Prior permission shall be obtained for *private aircraft* overflying or landing at Iraqi airports. The request must be submitted to ICAA at least 48 hours prior to the departure of the aircraft, or far enough in advance to ensure that the request can be approved by the ICAA, and a reply sent and received prior to scheduled departure.

Non-scheduled flights delaying into the next UTC day must coordinate with the ICAA to confirm permission for flight.

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

Traffic Stops (passengers and/or cargo) must be applied for, 7 days before commencement of first flight.

A Landing Slot Request Form or Overflight Request Form must be completed (see links). Request Forms must be submitted no later the 1500Z on the day prior to the flight.

Significant changes to a slot request may be made at any time up to 1500Z the day prior to the planned flight by submitting an updated request form to ICAA by email.

Private Flights

Prior Permission requests shall be submitted, at least 48 hours prior to departure, for private aircraft overflying or landing at Iraqi aerodromes.

Flight plans must be received at least 2 hours prior to entering the Bagdad FIR.

Private flights delaying into the next UTC day must re-coordinate with the ICAA to confirm permission for flight.

A Landing Slot Request Form must be completed (see links). Request Forms must be submitted no later the 1500Z on the day prior to the flight.

Float Planes

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

Light Sport Aircraft

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

Fees

There are varying fees for landing, ground handling, security, overflights, and air navigation.

Fuel

Fuel and other services may not be available at most airports. If fuel, ground handling or other services are required it must be coordinated through the airport. Refer to the free on-line Iraq AIP for ground handing contacts.

Night VFR

VFR flights at night are permitted in the Baghdad FIR below 14000FT. Aircraft conducting such flights shall comply with civil aviation regulation 23- Aircraft Instrument and Equipment (available on-line at http://www.iraqcaa.com/menu/reg.html)

Island Hopping

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Island Hopping requirements or restrictions.
