The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

## **Entry/Exit Requirements**

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

#### Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an <u>eAPIS</u> manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

### Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → Visa

Pilots – Same as passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

#### Aircraft -

- → 4 General Declarations (2 for Customs, 2 for Immigration)
- → 4 Passenger Manifest (2 for Customs, 2 for Immigration)
- → 2 Cargo Manifests (2 for Customs)
- → Certificate of Disinfection (coming from an infected area)

#### Exit Requirements (Departing Kenya)

- → Depart from an AOE
- → Same aircraft documents as required for arrival
- → File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

## Additional Flight Information

#### Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

In addition to U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements, most countries adhere to ICAO Annex 6 which defines aircraft instruments, equipment and documents.

The items listed below are for the pilot's reference to determine if the aircraft meets the minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

- → VHF Radio
- → SSR Transponder Mode C or S

#### For IFR:

- → ADF
- → VOR Receiver (in controlled airspace)
- → ACAS II (all turbine aircraft over 5700 kg MTOW or more than 19 passengers)

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Kenya must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6- Operation of Aircraft, Part I - International Commercial Air Transport - Airplanes, Chapter 6 (Airplane Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Airplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

#### **RVSM**

#### **Technical Stop / Overflight**

Applications should include the following information for non-scheduled operators:

- → Name and Nationality of operating company
- > Type of aircraft and registration marks
- Name of pilot and number of crew
- Date and time of arrival at and departure Kenya aerodromes; or overflying the Kenya Territory
- Route of flight including an origin and final destination of flight, last airports before Kenya and next airport(s) after Kenya
- → Purpose of flight
- Number of passengers or nature and amount of freight
- > Name, address and business of chatterer

Applications should include the following information for private flights:

- Name and address of the owner/operator
- → Type of aircraft
- > Registration marks and call sign
- → Date and place of origin of the flight
- Complete route itinerary including dates and times
- Number of passengers and crew
- → Purpose of flight

### Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

A clearance is required for all non-scheduled flights. An application should be made at least 72 hours prior to the date of intended flight to:

- Route of flight including an origin and final destination of flight, last airports before Kenya and next airport(s) after Kenya
- → Purpose of flight
- Number of passengers or nature and amount of freight
- Name, address and business of chatterer

## **Private Flights**

A clearance is required for overflying or landing for technical reasons. An application should be made at least 72 hours prior to the date of intended flight to:

#### **Fees**

Users should anticipate varying fees for landing, parking, passenger service, security and air navigation charges. Contact the AIS for further details.

#### Fuel

Jet A1 is available at all AOE's. Fueling availability times vary from airport to airport.

AvGas is available at most but not all AOE's. Fueling availability times vary from airport to airport.

## **Night VFR**

A pilot may not fly VFR at night unless specifically authorized to do so by ATC in the immediate vicinity of an aerodrome.

# **Country Specific Travel Information**

## **Public Health Requirements**

*Aircraft* – Aircraft originating from a quarantined area are required to be disinfected.

Pilots should refer to the DOT website below for any current requirements.

DOT: Aircraft Disinsection Requirements

Passengers – All passengers are required to hold vaccination certificates against yellow fever, cholera and smallpox on arrival from infected areas.

Note: Children under the age of one are exempted from this requirement in respect of yellow fever and cholera.
