Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents">IFIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Currency requirements and sanctions exist for Myanmar (Burma). Please review <u>Currency / U.S. Treasury Sanctions on the State Department Website</u>.

Import prohibitions for travelers

- a) Counterfeit coins and currencies
- b) Pornographic articles
- c) All kinds of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances
- d) Playing cards
- e) Goods bearing the imprint or reproduction of the flag of the Union of Myanmar
- f) Goods bearing the Emblem of Buddha or pagodas of Myanmar
- g) Toy Guns and remote controlled toys

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Incoming passengers are required to complete a customs declaration
- → Visas are required for some travelers for entry
- → Besides a Customs Baggage Declaration, a CR 193 form (in duplicate) is required for all visitors entering the Union of Myanmar on which they should declare all jewelry and other dutiable articles. A copy of the CR 193 form will be forwarded to the passenger after Customs inspection, and it is essential the form be retained for production to Customs officials on departure together with the articles declared thereof.

No documents or visas are required of passengers arriving and departing on the same through flight provided they do not leave the transit lounge.

Crew - Same as passengers

Note: Other requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight

- Note a) One copy of the General Declaration is endorsed and returned by Customs, signifying clearance.
 - b) If no passengers are embarking (disembarking) and no articles are laden (unladen), no aircraft documents except copies of the General Declaration need be submitted to the above authorities.

Exit Requirements (Departing Myanmar)

- → Depart from an AOE
- → File eAPIS manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other country requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meets those requirements.

The items listed below are for the pilot's reference to determine if the aircraft meets the minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

- → RNAV for all IFR flights
- → GPWS turbine aircraft take-off mass over 5700 kg or carries more than 9 passengers
- → Mode C Transponder per ICAO Annex 10, Vol,IV
- > ELT automatically activated type
- → TCAS V.7 (ACAS II) all turbine aircraft with take-off mass over 30, 000 lbs or more than 30 passenger seats

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Myanmar must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 – Operation of Aircraft, Part 1 – International Commercial Air Transport – Airplanes, Chapter 6 (Airplane Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Airplane Communication and Navigation Equipment)

RVSM

Technical Stop/Overflight

Overflight:

If an operator intends to perform a Non-schedule flight or a series of Non-schedule flights into the Union of Myanmar for the purpose of overflying, he shall apply to the Director General, Department of Civil Aviation, Yangon International Airport, Yangon 11021, Myanmar, Fax: 951 533008/533016, AFTN address: VYYYYAYX, E-mail: ats@dca.gov.mm in advance of 7 days from the effective date including information in the following order;

- a) Name of the operator and the mailing / billing address
- b) Type of aircraft and registration marks
- c) Full itinerary on schedule including point of departure, point of destination, date and time of overflight
- d) Purpose of overflight (Passenger or Cargo) or freight, if Cargo and freight, to declare of Cargo / freight
- e) Consignee / consignor or charterer
- f) Fax number, SITA address, AFTN address, contact person

Technical Stop: see Non-scheduled Flights and Private

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

If an operator intends to perform a non-schedule landing flight or a series of flights, the requirements are the same as for non-schedule overflights but with the following information in addition.

- a) Local sponsor's name and address
- b) Landing permission is to be requested 14 days in advance
- c) If passenger-charter flights, list names and nationality of passengers
- d) If cargo-charter flights, list names and nationality of passengers

Private Flights

The requirements for private flight requesting landing clearance is to be made as follows.

Permission to land at Yangon International Airport is to be made in advance of 7 days and 14 days in advance for other airports.

The requirements for private flights for the purpose of medical evacuation through or into Myanmar is to be made provided the following information are included in the request.

- → Local sponsor's name and address / phone number / fax number
- → Patient information such as name, disease, age presently attending hospital, caring doctor, organization of patient
- → Aircraft operator mailing address
- → Aircraft type and registration
- → Flight schedule date/time

Top priority will be given for such flight.

Float Planes

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

Light Sport Aircraft

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

Fees

Users should anticipate landing, passenger service, parking, hangarage, long term storage and air navigation charges.

Fuel

Night VFR

Unless specifically authorized by the Director-General, Night VFR requires an instrument rated pilot and aircraft regardless of weather conditions.
