Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

Airports of Entry

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- General Declaration
- Passenger Manifest
- Cargo Manifest
- Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at [/IFIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents](#). The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- File an [eAPIS](#) manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- File and activate international flight plan
- Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) – customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers –

- Valid passport
- [Visa](#) (Malta is a party to the Schengen Agreement. This means that, U.S. citizens may enter Malta for up to 90 days for tourist or business purposes without a visa.)

Pilots – Same as passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

Aircraft –

- 1 copy of General Declaration
- 1 copy of the Air Operator's Certificate (where applicable)
- 1 copy of the Insurance Certificate
- 1 copy of the Noise Certificate

Exit Requirements (Departing Malta)

- Depart from an AOE
- File [eAPIS](#) manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- File an international flight plan
- Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Malta must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 - *Operation of Aircraft*, Part 1 - *International Commercial Air Transport - Aeroplanes*, Chapter 6 (Aeroplane Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Aeroplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

RVSM

Technical Stop / Overflight

Malta is a party to the International Air Services Transit Agreement (Chicago Convention). Aircraft registered in States party to this Agreement can transit (overfly or make stops for non-traffic purposes) over Maltese territory subject to prior notification in. Additionally, the documents listed under Entry requirements; Aircraft, are also required.

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

Non-scheduled flights operated by commercial operators into, and out of, Malta require prior approval from the Civil Aviation Directorate – Transport Malta. The request to operate these flights is to include the following information:

- name of aircraft operator
- aircraft type and registration marks
- date and time of arrival at and departure from Malta
- place/s of embarkation/disembarkation of passengers or of freight
- purpose of flight and, where applicable, the nature of the cargo
- name and address charterer
- copy of the Air Operator's Certificate (where applicable)
- copy of the Insurance Certificate
- copy of the Noise Certificate

Private Flights

Only prior notification (through a flight plan or otherwise) and a copy of the applicable documents listed below.

- copy of the Air Operator's Certificate (where applicable)
- copy of the Insurance Certificate
- copy of the Noise Certificate

Float Planes

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

Light Sport Aircraft

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any LSA requirements or restrictions.

Fees

There may be some ground handling and air navigation fees.

Fuel

Jet A1 and AvGas are available 24 hours a day.

Night VFR

VFR flights may be allowed to operate at night within the Malta CTR (see AD 2-48) subject to the following conditions:

- ➔ The flight must be conducted not later than 2300 LT and not earlier than 0600 LT
- ➔ The ground visibility must not be less than 5 km and the ceiling must not be less than 1500 ft
- ➔ The flight must be operated as a local flight with departure and destination LMML.

Island Hopping

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Island Hopping requirements or restrictions.

Aeronautical Charts

The Civil Aviation Directorate – Transport Malta is responsible for the publication of all charts that are part of the AIP. These charts are kept up to date by amendments to the AIP.

Information concerning the planning for or issuance of new maps and charts is notified by Aeronautical Information Circular. If incorrect information detected on published charts is of operational importance, it is corrected by NOTAM.

Country Specific Travel Information

Public Health Requirements

Aircraft-

No public health measures are required to be carried out in respect of aircraft entering Malta except when it is known that the aircraft is coming from a country or area that may have been considered a quarantinable country or area during a specific period.

Passenger-

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required from disembarking passengers who are more than 9 months old and coming from an infected area. Infants under 9 months may be subject to isolation or surveillance if coming from an infected area.
