Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

## **Entry/Exit Requirements**

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

#### **Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)**

- → File an <u>eAPIS</u> manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

### Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → Visa
- → ICAO Landing/Departure Card
- → Valid international certificate of vaccination against cholera and yellow fever.

#### Pilots - Same as passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

#### Aircraft -

#### Arrival:

→ General Declaration – 2 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Health

- → Passenger Manifest 2 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Health
- → Cargo Manifest 2 for Customs
- → Written permission from NAMA (ATS Authority) to enter country

Note: If no passengers are embarking (disembarking) and no articles are laden (unladen), no aircraft documents except copies of the General Declaration need to be submitted to the above stated authorities.

## **Exit Requirements (Departing Nigeria)**

- → Landing/Departure Card
- → Depart from an AOE
- → File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

#### Departure:

- → General Declaration 1 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Health
- → Passenger Manifest 1 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Health
- > Cargo Manifest 2 for Customs
- → Valid international certificate of vaccination against yellow fever and cholera.

Note: If no passengers are embarking (disembarking) and no articles are laden (unladen), no aircraft documents except copies of the General Declaration need to be submitted to the above stated authorities.

## **Additional Flight Information**

#### Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Nigeria must adhere to the provisions of Nig. CAR Parts 7, 8 and 9.

Flights with single-engine and multi-engine aircraft which are not capable of maintaining the prescribed minimum safe altitude in the event of engine failure, the following emergency equipment shall be carried:

#### Signaling equipment

- → An emergency locator transmitter (ELT)
- > Two signal flares of the day and night type
- → Eight red signal cartridges and a means of firing them
- → A signal sheet (minimum 1 x 1 m) a reflecting color
- → A signal mirror
- → An electric hand torch.

#### Survival equipment

- → A compass
- → A knife
- → A sleeping bag with waterproof inner lining or a rescue blanket (Astron) per person
- → Four boxes of matches in waterproof containers
- → A ball of string
- → A cooking stove with fuel and the accompanying cooking and eating utensils.

## **Technical Stop / Overflight**

Flights making a Technical Stop or Overflight require prior permission, in writing, from the Director General of NCAA.

## Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

Non-scheduled flights require prior permission, not less than 48 hours in advance of the intended landing, for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers, cargo or mail. Application shall be made to: The Director General of NCAA for permission to carry out such operations not less than 48 hours in advance of the intended landing.

### **Private Flights**

Private flights must have prior permission in writing from the Director General of NCAA for all flights overflying Nigeria or making stops in the Nigerian territory,

#### **Float Planes**

The IFIM Staff is unaware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

#### **Light Sport Aircraft**

The IFIM Staff is unaware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

#### **Fees**

There are variable fees for landing, parking, passenger services air navigation and refueling fees associated with operations in Nigeria. For details, please contact the managing director at "Airport Charges" listed under Designated Authorities.

#### **Fuel**

Fuel is not available at all AOEs check with your destination airport authorities for availability.

### VFR/Night VFR

VFR not permitted above FL200 or at transonic or supersonic speeds.

#### Night VFR:

Unless authorized by the appropriate ATS authority, VFR flights shall not be operated between sunset and sunrise. Such flights shall be operated in accordance with the conditions prescribed by such authority.

#### **Island Hopping**

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Island Hopping requirements or restrictions.

## **Public Health Requirements**

Aircraft – No public health measures are required to be carried out in respect to aircraft entering Nigeria, unless, arriving from an infected area

Pilots should refer to the DOT website below for any current requirements.

DOT: <u>Aircraft Disinsection Requirements</u>

Passengers – The Airport Health Authority may medically examine any person arriving or departing and take appropriate sanitary measures.

Passengers and crew require a Cholera and Yellow Fever vaccination.
