All air carriers operating to LPPT, LPPS, LPMA and LPFR shall always submit a request for the allocation of available landing and/or take-off slots to the coordinator and receive approval before operating.

Entry/Exit Requirements

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at <u>IFIM Home>General Information>International</u> <u>Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents</u>. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

Entry Requirements

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- → Valid passport
- → <u>Visa</u> (If you are traveling for business or tourism you don't need a visa for entry into the Schengen area, but you must have a passport valid three months beyond the proposed stay.)

Pilots - Same as for passengers

Note: Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

Aircraft -

→ General Declaration – I copy for Public Health

Exit Requirements

- → Same documents as required for Entry (see *Aircraft* above)
- → Depart from an AOE
- → File eAPIS manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- → File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Portugal must adhere to the provisions of Annex 6 - Operation of Aircraft, Part I, Chapter 6 (Airplane Instruments, Equipment, and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Airplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements

- → VHF radio (8.33 KHZ spacing when operating above FL195)
- → Mode C 4096 transponder (within Lisboa FIR)
- → ACAS II (for fixed wing turbine aircraft with MTOGW of 5700 kg or more than 19 passenger seats)
- → RNAV-RNP-5 (for flight within Lisboa FIR/UIR)

Note: Aircraft not equipped with RNAV but able to achieve RNP 5 navigation accuracy may use lower airspace, FL195 or below, in ATS VOR/DME defined Routes

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop/Overflight

Non-scheduled:

A previous notification is only required in case of overflights or landings for non-traffic stop of non-scheduled flights by operators of ICAO Contracting States. The flight plan for the above operations shall be regarded as sufficient prior notification.

Private:

Authorization is required for all traffic stops, except in the case of own use flights performed for the operator himself.

Non-scheduled Commercial Flights (Charters)

Operators wishing to perform non-scheduled flights into and out of Portugal must be registered in the Instituto Nacional da Aviação Civil as being authorized to operate such flights.

International General Aviation and other Non-Scheduled Flights (flights coming from or leaving for Non-Schengen States) to/from **National Aerodromes** require prior Authorization from the Portuguese Civil Aviation Authority (Instituto Nacional da Aviação Civil - INAC), with notice to the Director of the Aerodrome concerned. The Operator shall submit the Application, a minimum of two working days in advance to:

The prior authorization requirement does not apply to flights to/from International Airports (Lisboa, Porto, Faro, Madeira, Porto Santo, Ponta Delgada and Santa Maria.

All air carriers operating to LPPT, LPPS, LPMA and LPFR and from these Coordinated Airports shall always submit a request for the allocation of available landing and/or take-off slots to the coordinator and receive approval before operating. Request must be copied to the handling agent, contact:

Ponta Delgada Airport was designated as Schedules Facilitated Airport (Level 2). Thus, all carriers operating to and from Ponta Delgada Airport shall submit their proposed schedules in advanced to the Schedules Facilitator (contact information noted above) and receive approval before operating.

Private Flights

International General Aviation and other Non-Scheduled Flights require prior Authorization from the Portuguese Civil Aviation Authority (Instituto Nacional da Aviação Civil - INAC), with notice to the Director of the Aerodrome concerned

Private flight must observe the same requirements, for Schedules Coordinated Airports and Schedule Facilitated Airports, as Non-scheduled commercial flights

Float Planes

The IFIM staff is not aware of any regulations concerning Float Planes in Portugal.

Light Sport Aircraft (LSA)

The IFIM staff is not aware of any regulations concerning Light Sport Aircraft in Portugal.

Fees

Users should anticipate varying fees for landing and takeoff, parking and hangar, passenger service charge, security charge, radar separation and after-hour airport charges as well as air navigation fees. Fee tables are available in the Portugal AIP available through

Fuel

Jet A1 is available at all AOE's. Avgas is only available at LPMA, LPPR and LPAZ.

Night VFR

Landing and take-off is forbidden by law between 0000 LMT (Local mean time) and 0600 LMT except in the case of force majeure.

Country Specific Travel Information

Public Health Requirements

Aircraft – Pilots must complete the health section of the General Declaration stating the sanitary conditions of the flight. The airport health authorities may require the sanitary inspection of the aircraft, containers and persons arriving on an international flight.

All aircraft coming from an airport located within an area where malaria or any other mosquito transmitted disease exists will be subject to disinsectation.

All aircraft *outbound* from LPMA and LPPS must be disinsected using authorized insecticide products with *d-phenotrin*, in spray form.

Passengers – Immunizations: Disembarking passengers are not required to present vaccination certificates except when coming directly from an infected area.
