# Flight Information

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

# **Entry/Exit Requirements**

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- → General Declaration
- → Passenger Manifest
- → Cargo Manifest
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at <u>IFIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents</u>. The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

# Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)

- → File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- → File and activate international flight plan
- → Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

#### Passengers -

- > Passport at least six months validity remaining
- → Visa not required for U.S. citizens for up to 90 day visit
- → Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate for those 9 months of age and older
- → Cholera/Smallpox Vaccination Certificate if coming form an infected area
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card

Crew - Same as passengers

Note: Other requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight

#### Aircraft -

- → General Declaration 1 for Immigration, 1 for Customs, 1 for Health, 1 for Security and Police
- Passenger Manifest 1 for Immigration, 1 for Health, 2 for Security and Police, 2 for RCAA
- → Cargo Manifest 2 for Customs, 1 for Health (if food), 1 for Security and Police

Note. - If no passengers are embarking (disembarking) and no articles are laden (unladen), no aircraft documents except copies of the General Declaration need be submitted to the above Authorities.

## **Exit Requirements (Departing Rwanda)**

- → Same documents as required for Entry (see *Aircraft* above)
- → Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- → Depart from an AOE
- → File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- > File an international flight plan
- → Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

# Additional Flight Information

### Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other country requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meets those requirements.

The items listed below are for the pilot's reference to determine if the aircraft meets the minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country (including overflight). Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

In addition to the equipment normally required by U.S. regulations, the following equipment is also needed:

### Signaling equipment:

- → An emergency locator transmitter (ELT)
- > Two signal flares of the day and night type
- → Eight red signal cartridges and a means of firing them
- → A signal sheet (minimum 1 x 1 m) in a reflecting color
- → An electric hand torch.

### Survival equipment:

- → A compass
- → A knife
- > Four boxes of matches in waterproof containers
- → A ball of string.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Rwanda must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 – Operation of Aircraft, Part 1 – International Commercial Air Transport – Aeroplanes, Chapter 6 (Aeroplanes Instruments, Equipment and Flight Documents) and Chapter 7 (Aeroplane Communication and Navigation Equipment)

#### **RVSM**

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

#### **Technical Stop/Overflight**

Non-scheduled:

Aircraft of Airlines of ICAO member States or enjoying, through bilateral agreements concluded with Rwanda, rights equivalent to those mentioned in article 5 (paragraph 1) of the Chicago Convention, may fly over (or make non-traffic stops) the territory of Rwanda under the conditions set in the forenamed convention or agreement, provided these countries accord the same facilities to Rwandese aircraft. However, an application for authorization shall be submitted to the Director General of Civil Aviation.

#### Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

An authorization of these flights shall be requested from the Director General at least three working days in advance (see Designated Authorities).

#### **Private Flights**

Normally, a request must be submitted to the Director General of CAA not less than THREE working days before of the intended time of flight. The application form can be found on the following CAA website:

#### **Float Planes**

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

#### **Light Sport Aircraft**

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

#### **Fees**

Users should anticipate varying fees for landing, parking, passenger service, security and air navigation.

#### Fuel

Jet A1 and Avgas are available at HRYR. There is no fuel available at HRZA.

### VFR/Night VFR

Unless authorized by the appropriate ATS authority, VFR flights shall not be operated above FL 170 or at transonic or supersonic speeds.

Night VFR:

VFR flights between sunset and sunrise, or such other period between sunset and sunrise as may be prescribed by the appropriate ATS authority, shall be operated in accordance with the conditions prescribed by such authority.
