## **Flight Information**

The accuracy and currency of information contained in this guide is uncertain due to the difficulty in obtaining the information and the rapidly changing environment. Aviators should always check with a country's aviation authority or a local aviation handler to determine any specific aircraft airworthiness/equipment and crew/passenger entry requirements.

## **Entry/Exit Requirements**

Entry and exit requirements are for aircraft departing the United States non-stop to country of destination. These requirements do not include any technical stops. Please refer to **Technical Stop** section in **Additional Flight Information** for the country at which the technical stop will be made.

Entry and Exit documentation forms vary from country to country. In general, however, ICAO member countries will accept the following standard ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit documents:

- General Declaration
- Passenger Manifest
- Cargo Manifest
- Embarkation/Disembarkation Card
- Certificate of Residual Disinsection

Examples of these documents can be found at [/FIM Home>General Information>International Flying Overview> ICAO Annex 9 Entry/Exit Documents](#). The acceptance of these ICAO documents must be confirmed by the appropriate AIS.

### **Entry Requirements (Departing the U.S.)**

- File an [eAPIS](#) manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- File and activate international flight plan
- Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) – customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

#### **Passengers –**

- Valid passport
- [Visa](#) (for stays of no more than 90 days)
- Some vaccinations (against cholera, smallpox, etc.) can be required when arriving from infected or endemic areas
- ICAO embarkation/disembarkation card

#### **Pilots – Same as passengers**

*Note:* Other pilot/crewmember requirements may be applicable in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification prior to flight.

#### **Aircraft –**

- General Declaration – 1 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Public Health
- Passenger manifest – 1 for Customs, 1 for Immigration, 1 for Public Health
- Cargo manifest – 1 for Customs
- Health section of general declaration completed, confirming disinfection 30 minutes prior to arrival.

## Exit Requirements (Departing Senegal)

- Depart from an AOE
- File [eAPIS](#) manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- File an international flight plan
- Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

## Additional Flight Information

### Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

U.S. aircraft airworthiness and certification requirements may not meet other countries requirements. It is the responsibility of the pilot to determine if the aircraft meet those requirements.

The items listed below are for pilots' reference to determine if the aircraft meets minimum instrument and equipment requirements of the destination country. Additional equipment may be required to comply with the airspace navigation requirements.

- VHF and HF communication and navigation equipment suitable for the route and landing

*Note: If equipped with TCAS, ACAS or transponder, must comply with ICAO standards*

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in the member states of ASECNA must be compliant with the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 - Operation of aircraft, Part 1- International Commercial Air Transport- Aircraft, Chapter 6 (Aircraft instruments, Equipments and Flight documents) and Chapter 7 (Airplane Communication and Navigation Equipment).

All aircraft assigned to fly over an inhospitable region must be provided with special facilities including signaling, emergency and survival equipments and the manuals to operate such equipment. **The requirements for flight over inhospitable regions are extensive and too numerous to list. One should reference the free on-line AIP for details.**

## **Fuel**

Jet A1 and Avgas are available at GOSS Saint-Louis and GOOY – Dakar/L.S. Senghor Airport. GOGS indicates that no fuel is available.

## **Night VFR**

VFR flights are not allowed over and above the flight level 150.

VFR flights are not authorized at night, which means, during the period that begins 15 minutes after the sunset and finishes 15 minutes before the sunrise.

## **Island Hopping**

## Country Specific Travel Information

### Public Health Requirements

*Aircraft* – No particular public health measures are required to be carried out in respect of aircraft in most of ASECNA States.

The aircraft may land under the condition that it has been disinfected approximately 30 minutes before its arrival on the aerodrome. The application of this measure must be properly recorded in the Health Section of the General Declaration.

However, when the insects spraying conditions stipulated in Annex 9 are not applied in theory or when the aircraft is coming from a cholera infection zone with recent cases declared, the sanitary control service can proceed to a new spraying of the aircraft on the ground before the disembarkation of passengers and crew.

If, in special circumstances, the public health authorities find it necessary a second spraying of the aircraft on the ground, passengers and crew are permitted to disembark beforehand.
