FINAL ORDER

By Order 86-11-30, issued and served November 14, 1986, the Department directed all interested persons to show cause why it should not condition the operating authority of all U.S. and foreign air carriers to prohibit those carriers and their agents from selling in the United States any transportation by air on Syrian Arab Airlines. Order 86-11-30 required that comments be filed not later than 1:00 p.m., November 21, 1986.

Order 86-11-30 stated that in the event no comments were filed, all further procedural steps would be deemed waived, and the Department would enter an order, subject to the disapproval of the President pursuant to section 801(a) of the Federal Aviation Act, which would make final our tentative findings and conclusions set forth in that Order. We have received no comments in response to Order 86-11-30.

ACCORDINGLY,

- 1. We make final the tentative findings and conclusions in Order 86-11-30;
- 2. We amend all U.S. air carrier certificates, all foreign air carrier permits and all exemptions held by U.S. and foreign air carriers to add the following condition:

Effective immediately and until further order of the Department, the holder and its agents shall not sell in the United States any transportation by air on Syrian Arab Airlines.

- 3. Unless disapproved by the President of the United States under section 801(a) of the Federal Aviation Act, this order shall become effective on the 61st day after its submission to the President, or upon receipt of advice from the President that he does not intend to disapprove the Department's order under section 801(a), whichever occurs earlier; 1/
- 4. We will serve a copy of this order on all U.S. air carriers holding certificates of public convenience and necessity or exemption authority, all foreign air carriers holding foreign air carrier permits or exemption authority, the Ambassador of Syria in Washington, D.C. and the United States Department of State.
