


Aircraft Certification Service (AIR) Organizational Structure

 Certification, Safety and Accountability Act (ACSAA)








AIR-300: Safety & Performance Integration








AIR-300: Safety & Performance Integration (Current)






AIR-500: Integrated Certificate Management (New)










AIR-600: Policy & Standards (Current)






AIR-700: Compliance <u>& Airworthiness</u>






AIR-700: Compliance & Airworthiness (Current)








AIR-800: System Oversight (Current)




