Subject: Wildlife Strike Reporting

Wildlife Facts:

- 1) Managing wildlife hazards at airports can be a complex activity.
- 2) Knowing the species involved in a bird strike can guide you to the right solution.
- 3) Reporting strikes provides a baseline to focus management efforts now and for the future.

The video is just over 12 minutes long and demonstrates how to collect bird strike remains, ship them to the Smithsonian for identification, and report the event to the FAA database (or the appropriate military database). We recommend that the personnel at your airport responsible for wildlife hazard management review this video and incorporate it within the 14 CFR Part 139.337 wildlife training program.
