DISEASE/CONDITION	EVALUATION DATA	DISPOSITION
A. Well-controlled AND No medication side effects	If the AME can determine the condition is under control, current medications are acceptable, and no symptoms that would interfere with flight or safety related duties AND Verifies a 7-day waiting period has elapsed since starting medication sacrosidase (Sucraid):	ISSUE Summarize findings in Item 60.
B. With severe complications	Submit the following for FAA review: 1. A current, detailed Clinical Progress Note generated from a clinic visit with the treating physician no more than 90 days before the AME exam. <i>It should include a summary of the history of the condition or diagnosis; current medications, dosages, and side effects (if any); clinical exam findings; results of any testing performed; diagnosis; assessment and plan (prognosis); and follow-up.</i> 2. Results of any other testing already performed by the treating physician.	DEFER Submit the information to the FAA for a possible Special Issuance. Summarize findings in Item 60.
