DISEASE/CONDITION	EVALUATION DATA	DISPOSITION
<b>A.</b> Asymptomatic;  Mild;  OR  Surgically corrected	If the AME can determine the condition has fully resolved without sequelae with no symptoms or current problems that would interfere with flight duties:	<div></div> <b>ISSUE</b> Annotate this information in Block 60.  If any underlying cause is found, see that section.
<b>B.</b> Symptomatic  OR  Affects cardiac or pulmonary function	Submit the following for FAA review:  <b>1.</b> The most recent, detailed Clinical Progress Note generated from a clinic visit with the treating physician. It must include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A detailed summary of the history of the condition;</li><li>• Current medications, dosage, and side effects (if any);</li><li>• Physical exam findings;</li><li>• Results of any testing performed;</li><li>• Diagnosis;</li><li>• Assessment and plan;</li><li>• Prognosis; and</li><li>• Follow-up.</li></ul> <b>2.</b> Copies of any testing already performed such as pulmonary function tests, cardiac echo, cardiac MRI, stress testing, etc.  If the AME has concerns with the applicant's ability to operate the aircraft during routine or emergency procedures, explain in Block 60.	<div></div> <b>DEFER</b>  Submit the information to the FAA for a possible Special Issuance  Annotate (elements or findings) in Block 60.
