No evaluation is required unless symptomatic or AME has concerns.</p>	ISSUE Summarize this history in Block 60.
B. Symptomatic OR Requiring treatment	<p>The pilot should submit the following for FAA review:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> A current, detailed Clinical Progress Note generated from a clinic visit with the treating physician or cardiologist no more than 90 days before the AME exam. It should include a detailed summary of the history of the condition or diagnosis; treatments and outcomes; current medications, dosages, and side effects (if any); physical exam findings; applicable test results; assessment; plan (prognosis); and follow-up. <input type="checkbox"/> ECG performed within the past 90 days or most recent (already performed). <input type="checkbox"/> 24-hour cardiac ambulatory monitor (CAM) such as holter. <input type="checkbox"/> Echocardiogram (echo). <input type="checkbox"/> Any other testing deemed necessary by the treating physician.
