Dear Airport Operators and Airport Industry Representatives:

We are circulating Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Draft Advisory Circular (AC) 150/5200-18D, Airport Safety Self-Inspection, to interested industry associations to obtain comment and recommendations of action to be taken.

The FAA recommends the guidelines contained in this AC. This AC provides voluntary guidance for all airport operators in developing self-inspection programs. It also provides standards for developing and implementing self-inspection programs at airports certificated under Title 14 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) part 139 (hereinafter referred to as part 139) that are acceptable to the Administrator. Part 139 regulations require an airport operator at a certificated airport to develop a self-inspection program acceptable to the Administrator as a means of compliance with § 139.327, Self-Inspection Program.

Please review this draft document and comment as appropriate. Please identify your recommended changes, provide a rationale for the recommendations, and specify the sections of the document they impact. The final document may be revised as a result of comments received and our further review.
