Dear Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting and Industry Representatives:

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Draft Advisory Circular (AC) 150/5210-26, Incident Management/Command and Control Training for Airport Personnel, is being circulated to interested industry associations to obtain comments and recommendations of actions to be taken.

The FAA recommends the guidelines contained in this AC to assist airport management to provide guidance to assist Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) departments with the minimum requirements for the selection of Incident Management/Command and Control Training for Airport Personnel. Meeting the standards in this advisory circular will qualify as meeting the intent of Title 14 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 139, Certification of Airports.

Please review this draft document, and comment as appropriate. Please identify your recommended changes, provide a rationale for the recommendations, and specify the sections of the document they impact. The final document may be revised because of comments received and our further review.
