SUBJ: Supervisory Notification of Suspicious UAS Activity

- 1. Purpose of This Notice.** This notice provides additional guidance to FAA Order JO 7110.65, Air Traffic Control, paragraph 2-1-26, Supervisory Notification.
- 2. Audience.** This notice applies to the following Air Traffic Organization (ATO) service units: Air Traffic Services, Mission Support Services, System Operations, Safety and Technical Training; Air Traffic Safety Oversight Service; William J. Hughes Technical Center; and Mike Monroney Aeronautical Center.

- 4. Cancellation.** This notice is canceled upon the publication of FAA Order JO 7110.65Z, Change 1, effective December 2, 2021.
- 5. Explanation of Policy Change.** This change adds suspicious Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) activity to the existing list contained in paragraph 2-1-26, which directs all personnel performing ATC duties to notify the operational supervisor (OS)/controller-in-charge (CIC) of flight activities that could have an impact to sector/position operations. It also adds FAA Order JO 7210.3, Appendix 7, as the reporting reference for suspicious UAS activity.
- 6. Procedures/Responsibilities/Action.** Amend FAA Order JO 7110.65 by changing paragraph 2-1-26 to read as follows:

2-1-26. SUPERVISORY NOTIFICATION

Title through subparagraph e, No change

f. Aircraft/pilot activity, including Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) operation that is considered suspicious, including unauthorized, hazardous, and/or threatening operations, as prescribed in FAA Order JO 7610.4, paragraph 7-3-1, and, for information more specific to UAS, FAA Order JO 7210.3, Paragraphs 2-1-30, 2-1-32, and Appendix 7.

No further changes to paragraph

7. Distribution. This notice is distributed to the following ATO service units: Air Traffic Services, Mission Support Services, and System Operations, and Safety and Technical Training; the Air Traffic Safety Oversight Service; the William J. Hughes Technical Center; and the Mike Monroney Aeronautical Center.

8. Background. Unauthorized or suspicious UAS operations potentially pose the same hazardous conditions as manned aircraft to the safety of flight. Therefore, it is imperative air traffic control personnel report any suspicious aircraft or pilot activity whether it involves manned or unmanned flights.
