SUBJ: Aircraft Equipment Suffix

- **1. Purpose of This Notice**. This Notice corrects FAA Order JO 7110.65W, paragraph 2-3-8, Aircraft Equipment Suffix, by reinstating the slant H (/H) suffix in subparagraph d.
- **2. Audience**. This notice applies to the following Air Traffic Organization (ATO) service units: Air Traffic Services, Mission Support Services, and System Operations Services; and all associated EnRoute air traffic control facilities.

- **4.** Cancellation. This Notice replaces N JO 7110.710, Aircraft Equipment Suffix, effective April 8, 2016.
- **5. Procedures**. Change FAA Order JO 7110.65, paragraph 2-3-8 to read as follows:

2-3-8. AIRCRAFT EQUIPMENT SUFFIX

Title thru c., no change

<u>d.</u> Utilize aircraft equipment suffix <u>/H</u> to indicate "RVSM-capable, no transponder."

 $/\underline{H}$ is for ATC use only. Users are not authorized to file this suffix.

- **5. Distribution**. This notice is distributed to the following ATO service units: Air Traffic Services; Systems Operations Services; Safety and Technical Training Services; in addition to the Air Traffic Safety Oversight Service and the William J. Hughes Technical Center.
- **6. Background.** A document change proposal was submitted for FAA JO 7110.65W that would have added an additional aircraft equipment suffix, slant O (/O), for RVSM capable aircraft with an operating transponder but with no Mode C altitude reporting capability. Instead of adding the /O suffix, the published change incorrectly substituted the existing slant H (/H) suffix with the /O suffix. Additionally, as of the effective date of the order, the /O had not been adapted in the various automation platforms for use by air traffic control.

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This Notice corrects FAA Order JO 7110.65W, paragraph 2-3-8, Aircraft Equipment Suffix, by reinstating the /H suffix in subparagraph d. Adaptation of the /O is still being discussed and may be instituted at a future date.
