

### **SUBJ:** Line Check Requirements for Part 121 Pilots Age 60 or Older

---

- 1. Purpose of This Notice.** This notice informs aviation safety inspectors (ASI) of the amendment to Title 49 of the United States Code (U.S.C) § 44729 (h) and how this amendment affects Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations (14 CFR) part 121 pilots who are age 60 or older.
- 2. Audience.** The primary audience for this notice is Certificate Management Office (CMO) and Flight Standards District Office (FSDO) ASIs. The secondary audience includes Flight Standards branches and divisions in the regions and in headquarters.
- 3. - 4. Background.** On February 14, 2012 the President signed into law the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012 (Public Law 112-95). Section 305 of this law amends 49 U.S.C. § 44729 (h) by removing the requirement for a line check every six (6) months for any pilot serving in part 121 operations who has attained the age of sixty (60). Based on this statutory amendment, the line check requirements for pilots who have attained age 60 under 14 CFR part 121, § 121.440(d)-(e) are no longer applicable.
- 5. Action.** Air carriers are no longer required to conduct this line check. ASIs will review this notice and provide a copy to each certificate holder. In addition, they may approve revisions to any training program that removes the requirement for this line check.
- 6. Disposition.** We will incorporate the information in this notice into FAA Order 8900.1 before this notice expires. Direct questions concerning this notice to the Air Transportation Division, AFS 200, at (202) 267-8166.
