**SUBJ: ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATIVE REPORT IDENTIFICATION
CODES FOR VIOLATIONS IN SECURITY-RELATED AIRSPACE**

- 1. PURPOSE.** This notice provides inspector guidance and standardization for the development of Enforcement Investigative Report (EIR) packages for flight operations that occur in security-related airspace.
- 2. DISTRIBUTION.** This notice is distributed to the division level in the Flight Standards Service in Washington headquarters; to the branch level in the regional Flight Standards divisions; to the Flight Standards District Offices, and to the Regulatory Standards Division at the Mike Monroney Aeronautical Center. This notice is also distributed electronically to the division level in the Flight Standards Service in Washington headquarters and to all regional Flight Standards divisions and district offices. - 3. BACKGROUND.** After the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the FAA was asked to investigate and enforce violations in special security-related airspace. It is now necessary to statistically identify these security-related airspace locations on FAA Form 2150-5, Enforcement Investigative Report. The following is a list of the types of security-related airspace and their identification codes:
 - a. 01 Washington Air Defense Identification Zone (DC ADIZ),
 - b. 02 Washington Federal Restricted Zone (DC FRZ),
 - c. 03 P-40 (Camp David, MD),
 - d. 04 P-47 (PAMTEX Spec. Weapons, Amarillo, TX),
 - e. 05 P-49 (Crawford Texas Ranch),

- f. 06 P-56 (White House & Capitol),
- g. 07 P-67 (Kennebunkport, ME), and
- h. 08 Presidential Movement Areas.

4. ACTION. In preparing FAA Form 2150-5, block 18, Regulations Believed Violated, after identifying the appropriate regulations, inspectors must specifically identify the security-related airspace, as identified in paragraph 3, in the “Remarks” section. For example:

5. DISPOSITION. This notice will be incorporated into Order 8400.10, Air Transportation Operations Inspector’s Handbook, and Order 8700.1, General Aviation Operations Inspector’s Handbook.
