This memorandum provides the rationale for canceling the subject order. The Office of Aerospace Medicine (AAM) fully supports and encourages the concept of health fitness. However, FAA Order 3910.1 - Department of Transportation Employee Fitness Center is no longer applicable to the mission and goals of our office. AAM has no authority or responsibility for the Fitness Center. We made several attempts to transfer this order to the Office of Human Resources, Facilities Management, and to the Office of International Affairs, but were unsuccessful. We later researched the history of this order to discover that an independent board of directors had been giving authority by the FAA Administrator to manage the FAA Fitness Center. We discussed our findings with you and agreed that this order could be cancelled.

In summary, this order should be cancelled immediately.
