SUBJ: USE OF FAA TELEPHONES BY REPRESENTATIVES OF OTHER U.S. GOVERNMENT AGENCIES OR
AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS

1. **PURPOSE.** This order establishes regional policy with respect to the placing of long distance toll calls over FAA telephones by representatives of other U.S. Government agencies or affiliated organizations.
2. **DISTRIBUTION.** This order is distributed to section level in regional headquarters and to all field offices and facilities.
3. **CANCELLATION.** Order AL 1770.4 dated 12/12/63, is cancelled.
4. **POLICY.**
 - a. It is the policy of this region to actively cooperate with representatives of other U.S. Government agencies in the accomplishment of their official functions. Accordingly, such representatives may be permitted to use FAA field station telephones, either Government-owned or commercial, for collect, official business, long distance calls. No toll charges may be assessed against FAA for such calls.
 - b. Representatives of U.S. Government-affiliated organizations, such as the Civil Air Patrol, may be permitted to use FAA telephones for official business long distance calls, provided such calls are placed on a collect basis. Where doubt exists as to the validity or official nature of a request for telephone service received from a representative of a U.S. Government-affiliated organization, an FAA employee should place the desired long distance call to ensure that toll charges will be accepted by the called agency
