SUBJ: FAA ADVISORY CIRCULARS

- * **1. PURPOSE.** This order states the requirement for air traffic field facilities, other than satellites, to maintain a current file of advisory circulars and incorporates the changes included in the latest edition of Order 1320.46, FAA Advisory Circular System.
- 2. DISTRIBUTION.** This directive is distributed to branch/staff level in the Air Traffic Division, air traffic field facilities in the Southwest Region, and NATCA/NAATS regional representatives.
- 3. CANCELLATION.** Order SW 1320.5C, FAA Advisory Circulars, dated January 9, 1987, is canceled.
- 4. BACKGROUND.** Since the advisory circular system was implemented in August 1962, several subjects have been covered that are of particular interest to the Air Traffic Division. These advisories fall in the general subject numbers 90-107, "Airspace" and "Air Traffic and General Operating Rules."
- 5. PROCEDURES.**
- a. All air traffic field facilities, except satellites, shall continue to maintain a current file of advisory circulars falling in the general subject numbers 90-107.
 - b. Facilities may also maintain circulars concerning other subject matter areas.
