- **2. BACKGROUND:** An agreement was reached between the FAA and DoD to include DOD certified aircraft, operated by U.S. Government agencies, in the definition of DoD RVSM excepted aircraft. Service providers need clarification and guidance on what a "DOD certified aircraft" is so exceptions can be granted as appropriate.
- **3. EXPLANATION OF CHANGE:** This change adds language to list specific aircraft types of DOD certified aircraft used by NASA that meet the exception criteria. This change cancels and incorporates N JO 7210.722, Reduced Vertical Separation Minimum (RVSM) Exceptions and Department of Defense (DOD) Certified Aircraft, effective July 31, 2009.
