

VAPES ON A PLANE

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) wants you to help prevent fire risks on aircraft caused by electronic smoking devices, like vaporizers (vapes) and e-cigarettes (e-cigs) that contain lithium batteries. How can you help? Follow these tips:



Carry-on Only

Vapes, e-cigs and spare batteries are only allowed in carry-on bags. Remove vapes, e-cigs and spare lithium batteries from luggage that is checked at the gate.



Deactivate Devices

Do not use or charge vapes or e-cigs while onboard the aircraft. Prevent them from accidentally turning on. For example, place the vapes or e-cigs into a protective case, or remove the battery.



Protect Batteries

Protect each spare battery from short circuit. For example, place each battery in its own case or plastic bag.
