AVIATION SAFETY INSPECTORS

Aviation Safety Inspectors (ASIs) are the FAA's on-site detectives. In this role, you will administer, investigate and enforce safety regulations and standards for the production, operation, maintenance and modification of all aircraft flying today.

There are different types of ASIs in four disciplines:

- › **Avionics:** Evaluate avionics technicians, training programs and repair facilities as well as investigate incidents and inspect aircraft and related equipment.
- › **Manufacturing:** Inspect aircraft, aircraft parts, avionics equipment and manufacturing facilities as well as issue production and original airworthiness certifications.
- › **Maintenance:** Evaluate aviation mechanics, their facilities and training programs as well as inspect aircraft and related equipment for airworthiness.
- › **Operations:** Evaluate airmen, their training programs, equipment and facilities as well as investigate accidents and violations of major carriers.

QUALIFICATIONS

Qualifications vary according to job position. U.S. citizenship and pre-employment drug screening are required for some positions.
