Registration of N5592B; Cessna 182

The Application for Registration of this aircraft has been referred to our office for review. The FAA Aircraft Registry questions registration of the aircraft to a Common Law Unincorporated Business Organization in view of the limited authority given to the FAA by the Federal Aviation Act of 1958, as amended (49 U.S.C. 1301 et seq.; the Act).

The Act requires registration to owners who are either U.S. citizens, resident aliens or foreign-owned corporations with aircraft based and primarily used in the U.S. The Act defines "citizen" (49 U.S.C. 1301(16)) as an individual, a partnership composed of individuals, or a corporation or association created or organized under the laws of the United States or of any State, of which the president, and two-thirds or more of the board of directors and other managing officers thereof are such individuals, and in which at least 75 per centum of the voting interest is owner or controlled by individual citizens.

We are concerned about whether or not your Unincorporated Business Organization meets these tests. Of primary concern is that the State of Nevada confers the status of legal entity on it. Accordingly, please provide us with Nevada statutory authority which allows Far Horizons Company, Ltd. to be recognized as a legal entity, or otherwise how the Company meets the definition given by the Federal Aviation Act of 1958.

We will withhold registration and any further action on this aircraft until we hear from you. If you require temporary authority to operate the aircraft pending registration, please get in touch with the Registry.
