#### ORDER

On October 20, 2003, Glock, Inc. ("Glock") filed the above referenced protest ("Protest") challenging the award of a contract to Heckler & Koch, Inc. ("H&K") under Solicitation No. DTSA-20-03-R-00932 issued by the Transportation Security Administration ("TSA") for the purchase of pistols associated with the Federal Flight Deck Officer program.

The attached Office of Dispute Resolution for Acquisition ("ODRA") Findings and Recommendations conclude that Glock failed to show TSA's award to H&K was arbitrary and capricious, lacked a rational basis, or reflected an abuse of discretion. Furthermore, Glock failed to show it was prejudiced by TSA's evaluation process. For these reasons, I hereby deny the Glock Protest in its entirety.

This is the final Agency order in this matter. To the extent this discretion is subject to review, such review shall be sought in accordance with 49 U.S.C. § 46110 and the ODRA Procedural Rule, 14 C.F.R. § 17.33, within sixty (60) days of the issuance of this Order.
