Airport

Driving from Virginia

From Points South

Take I-495 to 395 North to Washington, DC. Cross the 14th Street Bridge to Independence Avenue. Turn right on Independence Avenue, go 2 blocks to 7th Street. Turn left on 7th and go 10 blocks to Mt. Vernon Place. The Convention Center will be on your left.

From Points North

Take I-495 to I-66 East to Washington, DC. Take the Route 50/Constitution Avenue exit. Proceed on Constitution Avenue to 7th Street. Turn left and proceed North for 9 blocks on 7th Street to Mt. Vernon Place. The Convention Center will be on your left.

Driving from Maryland

From Points North

Take I-95 South to the Baltimore-Washington Parkway (exit 22B) toward Washington, DC. Exit on US Route 50 West (on the right).

US Route 50 becomes New York Avenue which becomes Mt. Vernon Place. The Convention Center will be on your right.

From Points East

Take US Route 50 West. US Route 50 becomes New York Avenue which becomes Mt. Vernon Place. The Convention Center will be on your right.

From Points West

Take I-270 to the Washington Beltway (I-495) West toward Northern Virginia. Take the George Washington Parkway exit to 395 North to the 12th Street exit. From 12th Street turn right on Massachusetts Avenue. Massachusetts Avenue will become Mt. Vernon Place. The Convention Center will be on your left.

Metro
