What is multi-factor authentication?

- Multi-factor authentication is a layered approach to securing data and applications. The FAA uses **MyAccess** to authenticate users.

Why is multi-factor authentication being implemented?

- Increases the security of FAA applications.

What does this mean?

- You will no longer use your old AMCS username and password.
- You will still use AMCS to transmit; however, **MyAccess** is being utilized for the login process.
- **The email address you use to log in via MyAccess MUST match the information associated with your AMCS account.**
