

# What do I do as an AME if my pilot tells me they've had a recent\* DUI?

\*within the past 5 yrs

## Find out if they've had any prior DUI offenses



The National Driver Registry (NDR) does a check automatically, but will not show offenses outside the statute of limitations, or in a different state.

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### Office of Aerospace Medicine Requirements:

14 days

60 days



### FAA Security Requirements:

The pilot must notify FAA's Security and Hazardous Materials Safety Office (AXE-700) of any conviction or administrative action for DUI/DWI.

This is mandated by statute: 14 CFR part 61.15. The Notification letter must be filled in and submitted within 60 days of the motor vehicle conviction or administrative action for DUI/DWI.

Reminder: Tell the pilot if the DUI/DWI is over 60 days old that they must submit the Notification to Security anyway.

A. **Airman Statement:** current consumption of alcohol and drugs

B.  $BAC > .15 =$  defer to FAA **Blood Alcohol Content**

C. results of field sobriety tests **Court/Police Reports**

breathalyzer results if they refused a test

refusal to test = positive test

D. **Driving Record**
