Pilot Registration Process for PRD

Complete the following steps in this order:

- 1. Create a Login.gov account, then
- 2. Create a PRD Pilot account

Applicability:

• Only those pilots that hold a Commercial, ATP or Remote pilot certificate and hold a valid FAA medical can register for PRD. If you do not hold the aforementioned credentials, then you will be denied PRD access.

Create a Login.gov account

Complete Login.gov registration process: Create your Login.gov account | Login.gov

NOTE: If you already have a login.gov account then skip this step and proceed to the "Create a PRD Pilot account" section below.

IMPORTANT: You will be required to verify your account through a Multifactor Authentication process. Options will include the installation of an authentication app or the ability to receive SMS text code. To understand this process more, read this: Authentication methods | Login.gov

Create a PRD Pilot account

- Access the pilot first-time user registration site here: prd.faa.gov (Pilot)
- You will be prompted to confirm your identity by signing into your Login.gov: How to sign in to Login.gov
- You'll then be redirected to the FAA page to register for your PRD pilot role.

NOTE: Ensure you enter the information EXACTLY as it appears on your current ATP, Commercial or Remote Pilot certificate (<u>DO NOT</u> Use Your CFI Certificate information). If you receive an error when submitting your information, then read this help guide for solutions.

NOTE: You must have a valid FAA Medical (military medicals will Not be accepted). If it is expired, invalid, or over 3 years old, you will be unable to register.
