There are four specialty areas:

INVESTIGATIONS

Investigate alleged or suspected violations of Federal Regulations, policies, and practices to include personal claims, medical, or behavioral patterns of airmen, security suitability of agency personnel, or other matters as directed.

QUALIFICATIONS

Experience in various principles, concepts, and methodologies of investigative techniques to perform professional investigative work and analysis. Skilled in developing clear and concise written reports.

INFRASTRUCTURE PROTECTION

Conduct assessments, inspections, and/or evaluations of programs, facilities, plan and design specifications and contracts to determine compliance with FAA security requirements.

QUALIFICATIONS

Experience in conducting inspections, assessments, surveys and/or evaluations to determine the security posture of programs, contracts, blueprints and/or facilities. Must be able to analyze information to determine the existence of actual or potential security threats. Skilled in defining and implementing critical infrastructure protection concepts, approaches, methodologies, techniques and policies.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS SAFETY

Evaluate significant safety issues, compliance trends and performance data for the oversight of hazardous materials transported by air.

QUALIFICATIONS

Experience interacting with internal and external audiences, which demonstrates engagement, oversight, information sharing and education using a risk-based methodology with outcomes of a positive impact on aviation safety.

PERSONNEL SECURITY

Personnel Security Specialists help determine if an employee or contractor is suitable to work at the FAA and whether or not they merit a security clearance should the position require one. ID Media Specialists issue Personal Identity Verification (PIV) cards and other ID cards, troubleshoot PIV card technical issues and provide customer service to all ID card users.

QUALIFICATIONS

Strong customer service and teamwork skills is a must. Experience with federal personnel security rules and systems (OPM standards, e-QIP system) or ID media regulations and tools (HSPD-12 card management systems, fingerprinting, etc.) is a plus.
