

# When in doubt, leave it out!



#### **Fireworks:**

Signal flares, firecrackers, sparklers or other explosives

#### Weapons:

Ammunition\*, gunpowder, mace\*, tear gas or pepper spray\*

### **Lithium Batteries:**

e-cigarettes, power banks, spare lithium batteries, devices with a lithium ion battery that exceeds 100 watt hours (Wh)\*

Household Items: Drain cleaners and solvents

## **Compressed Gases:**

Spray cans<sup>\*</sup>, butane fuel, pressurized scuba tanks, propane tanks, oxygen bottles, self-inflating rafts, flammable aerosols

## **Other Dangerous Goods:**

Dry ice\*, gasoline powered tools, camping equipment with fuel, wet-cell batteries\*, oxidizers, corrosives, radioactive materials (including radio-pharmaceuticals), poisons, infectious substances

This list is not all-inclusive.

\*May be allowed with restrictions.



Most dangerous goods are forbidden in carry-on and checked baggage. There are a few exceptions for some personal items such as toiletries, medicines, battery powered electronics and assistive devices. Remember, this is just a listing of common dangerous goods; if you don't see your item here it doesn't mean it's allowed in baggage. Check the PackSafe website or call your airline for exceptions.
