Fireworks:

Signal flares, firecrackers, sparklers or other explosives

Weapons:

Ammunition*, gunpowder, mace*, tear gas or pepper spray*

Lithium Batteries:

e-cigarettes, power banks, spare lithium batteries, devices with a lithium ion battery that exceeds 100 watt hours (Wh)*

Household Items:

Drain cleaners and solvents

Compressed Gases:

Spray cans*, butane fuel, pressurized scuba tanks, propane tanks, oxygen bottles, self-inflating rafts, flammable aerosols

Other Dangerous Goods:

Dry ice*, gasoline powered tools, camping equipment with fuel, wet-cell batteries*, oxidizers, corrosives, radioactive materials (including radio-pharmaceuticals), poisons, infectious substances

This list is not all-inclusive.

**May be allowed with restrictions.*

DO NOT PACK IN CHECKED BAGGAGE

Most dangerous goods are forbidden in carry-on and checked baggage. There are a few exceptions for some personal items such as toiletries, medicines, battery powered electronics and assistive devices. Remember, this is just a listing of common dangerous goods; if you don't see your item here it doesn't mean it's allowed in baggage. Check the PackSafe website or call your airline for exceptions.
