Review the information below to be prepared.

What is multi-factor authentication?

- Multi-factor authentication is a layered approach to securing data and applications. The FAA uses MyAccess to authenticate users.

Why is multi-factor authentication being implemented?

- Increases the security of FAA applications.

Who will be impacted?

- AMEs and their staff who log in to AMCS to transmit flight physical exams.
- Staff members who transmit for multiple AMEs will see the biggest changes.

When will the AMCS multi-factor authentication update be released?

- Target date for go-live is March 2024.

What do I need to do to prepare?

- Pre-register before go-live. This will ensure a smooth transition on the day the update is released.
 - AMEs who have already registered with MyAccess for DMS should skip this step.
- Review AMCS MyAccess Integration information at www.faa.gov/go/amcs

What's in it for me?

- Reduces the number of usernames and passwords for various FAA applications.
 - You must use the same email address used to register with MyAccess for DMS
- Reduces password reset frequency.
