Part 139 SMS Waivers: Eligibility and Requests

- Only certain airports certificated under Part 139 are required to comply with new SMS requirements. These airports are defined under new §139.401(a).
- Some Part 139 airports that must comply with new SMS requirements can apply for a waiver per new §139.401(d).
- Waiver requests are only required from certificated airports covered by new SMS requirements.

 Large/Medium/Small Hub Airports (Part 139.401(a)(1))



 Airports with 100K operations average over last 3 years (Part 139.401(a)(2))



• Landing Rights, Port-of-Entry, or User Fee Airports not in above categories (Part 139.401(a)(3))





Part 139 airports that must comply with new SMS requirements but can request a waiver as defined in new §139.401(d). This includes:

- Only Part 139 airports defined under §139.401(a)(3),* and
- Part 139 airports that have no tenants required to comply with SMS requirements of any jurisdiction.



^{*}Part 139 airports classified as a port of entry, international airport, landing rights airport or user fee airport.

Is my airport eligible to request a waiver*?

*Applies ONLY to "139.401(a)(3) – Int'l air carrier passenger operations" triggered airports


How do I find out if my airport qualifies for a waiver under new Part 139 SMS requirements?

- FAA determines if a Part 139 airport is eligible for a SMS waiver.
- Determination made using information from FAA's Air Carrier Activity database and US Customs data on FAA Form 5010, Airport Master Record.
- FAA maintains a list of Part 139 airports, know as the *Airport Certification Status List* (ACSL). This list notes which Part 139 airports are eligible for a SMS waiver.

A SMS waiver is NOT an Exemption under Part 139.111

- Airports eligible for a SMS waiver are not exempted from SMS requirements. The granting of a SMS waiver is temporary and based only on an airport meeting certain criteria specified in regulation.
- In contrast, exemptions granted under Part 139.111 can apply to any Part 139 requirement and are based on individual airport circumstances. As such, the exemption approval process is more involved, including a public comment period.



Part 139 SMS – Change to Waiver Eligibility

- If basis for an airport's eligibility for a SMS waiver changes, the certificate holder must inform FAA
- Changes to eligibly status include:
 - FAA reclassifying airport as a Large, Medium or Small Hub Airport
 - Aircraft operations increase to more than 100,000 annual operations
 - Air carrier or another airport tenant has a new regulatory requirement for SMS
 - Waiver expires
- If no longer eligible for waiver, certificate holder has
 18 months from notification of FAA decision to submit a SMS Implementation Plan.



Part 139 SMS – How to Request a Waiver

- To obtain a SMS waiver, the certificate holder must -
 - Submit a written request to FAA; and
 - Send the request, via letter or email, to the appropriate FAA Regional Airports Division
 Manager (go to https://www.faa.gov/airports/regions for region contact info)
- Waiver requests must include a justification for the waiver, including explanation as to how the airport meets criteria specified in Part 139.
- SMS waiver requests must be initiated by the certificate holder, not the FAA.



Part 139 SMS – How to Request a Waiver

What should a SMS Waiver Request contain?

- A description of the airport's annual aircraft operations and enplanements.
- A description of air carriers and other passenger-carrying aircraft operations, including any regulatory SMS requirement.
- Confirmation that no air carriers or other aircraft operators are transporting passengers to and from the airport from an international location.
- Any additional or unique information that supports a waiver from SMS requirements.



Part 139 SMS – Waiver Granting Process

- Upon receipt of written waiver request from a certificate holder,
 FAA regional offices will review the request with FAA
 Headquarters.
- FAA Headquarters will issue a decision on the waiver request.
- The Airport Certification and Safety Inspector assigned to the airport for which the waiver was requested will notify the certificate holder of FAA's decision.



Part 139 SMS – Waiver Granting Process

- Once granted, a SMS waiver is valid for 2 years from date of issuance (NOT 24 consecutive calendar months).
 - Upon or before waiver expiration, the certificate holder must re-apply for another waiver.
- Update your Airport Certification Manual
 - Add Section 401, Safety Management System
 - Note the airport is waived from the requirement until ##/##/####
 - Add FAA Waiver Letter as an exhibit to your ACM



Part 139 SMS – Waiver Granting Process

Don't wait until the last minute to submit a waiver request!

- Waiver application can be made at any time the airport is eligible.
- However, if FAA denies a waiver request, the certificate holder is still required to submit to FAA a SMS Implementation Plan by the prescribed due date.
